


# *What this presentation will do for you!!!*

- This presentation will show you how to install and use the International Military Student Pre-Departure Briefing CD.
- You'll need to put the IMS CD in your CD drive. If you **know** that you're not permitted to install software on your machine, get someone to "log in" to your machine with administrator privileges.
- **Look** at each step in this presentation, minimize, and then **do** that action using the IMS CD.




# IMS Pre-Departure CD Install 1<sup>st</sup> Page

When the CD is put in your drive, it will auto-run. One of the following screens will appear on your monitor:



This screen appears if the IMS briefing is not installed.




This screen will appear if the IMS briefing is already installed on your machine. Skip ahead to slide [12](#) of this presentation.



# IMS Pre-Departure CD Install 2nd Page

**This screen describes minimum hardware requirements, Internet connection considerations and the need for QuickTime 5.**



**Read the text, then Click on Next**




# IMS Pre-Departure CD Install

## 3<sup>rd</sup> Page

**Click on either **Install to Hard Drive** or **Run from CD-ROM****

**This screen allows you to choose between installing the IMS briefing completely on your hard drive (290 Mb space required), which allows you to remove the CD from the drive, or install only the start-up files (8.5 Mb required), which requires the CD to be in the drive in order to run.**



**When ready, **Click on Next****




# IMS Pre-Departure CD Install

## 4<sup>th</sup> Page

To change the default Destination Folder, **Click on Browse**, then **select a different directory (Optional !)**

By default, the IMS briefing will install in C:\Program Files\ DISAM\IMS Pre-Departure Briefing. If you want to change it, you can do so on this screen. We recommend you leave the defaults in place.



When ready, **Click on Next**




# IMS Pre-Departure CD Install

## 5<sup>th</sup> Page

**Click** on any entry in this window (optional), or accept the default.

Whether you install IMS Briefing completely to the hard drive or have it run from the CD, icons to start the program will be placed both in a program folder and on your desktop. Note that you can change which program folder will be used, but there will always be an icon installed on your desktop as well.





**This screen verifies the settings you have selected.**


# IMS Pre-Departure CD Install

## 7<sup>th</sup> Page


The IMS Briefing requires Apple QuickTime version 5 or greater to operate correctly. When this message appears, it only verifies that you have *some* version of QuickTime installed on your machine. If you know that QuickTime 4 or less is installed, you'll need to manually install QuickTime 5, which is on this disk.

If QuickTime is not found on your system, the message to the right will appear, prompting you to install it.



**Click on **OK** to finish IMS installation**




**Click on **OK** to install QuickTime, then finish IMS installation**



# IMS Pre-Departure CD Install 7th Page (continued)

**After closing the QuickTime info message, the IMS briefing will create the program icons on your system. If you elected the “Install to Hard Drive” option, this screen will indicate progress on the transfer of files to your hard drive.**


**This screen will close automatically when finished.**





# IMS Pre-Departure CD Install 8th Page

This screen will be displayed when the IMS Briefing has finished loading on your machine .



Click on **Finish** to close.



# Starting the IMS Briefing from the desktop

If you elected “Install to Hard drive, the “IMS Briefing Icon will be on your desktop. The program will run without the CD in the drive.

If you elected “Run from CD-ROM”, the IMS Briefing on CD” will be on your desktop. Be sure the CD is still in the CD drive!



**DoubleClick on whichever icon is on your desktop to start the briefing.**



# Starting the IMS Briefing from the Start Menu


You will find a similar icon for the IMS Briefing in your Programs directory.

The example here is from Windows XP. Windows 95, 98, ME and Windows 2000 all display this icon in a similar manner.

**1. Click on Start**

**2. Click on All Programs**

**3. DoubleClick on the IMS Briefing icon**




# IMS Briefing QuickTime Error

# QuickTime 5 Installation

## Page 1


**1. Click here to display the file folders on the CD.**

Right-Click on “Start”, then “Explore”, then find your CD-ROM drive in the directory.

Click on the CD-ROM icon to highlight it.

The CD-ROM’s folders will be displayed in the right-hand frame.

Double-click on the file folder labeled “QuickTime”



**2. Double click here to display the QuickTime installation files on the CD**




# QuickTime 5 Installation

## Page 2

**Double-Click on “QuickTimeInstaller.exe” to start the QuickTime 5 Installation Program.**

**Remember, if you do not have administrator privileges on your machine, you may not be able to load programs. If this is the case, get someone with administrator privileges to log in to your machine.**





**We recommend you accept the defaults, although you may change it if necessary.**





This screen starts QuickTime 5 configuration on your computer.




The defaults are fine for the IMS Briefing, so go to the next screen



